FOOD SERVICES

The food services program shall be under the supervision of the school nutrition director. The cafeteria staff in each school shall be responsible to the school nutrition director, but shall cooperate with the principal of the school in all matters essential to the proper functioning of the school nutrition program. The building principal shall be responsible for the control of student behavior in the cafeteria.

The District's food services program shall adhere to applicable federal and state laws, and to applicable guidelines set for participation in the National School Breakfast Program (NSBP) and the National School Lunch Program (NSLP).

As required for participation in the NSBP and NSLP, the District agrees to the following regulations:

1. That the food service programs be operated on a nonprofit basis.
2. That a "Type A" lunch be made available for students to meet at least one-third of the daily recommended levels for protein, calcium, iron, Vitamin A, Vitamin C, and calories.
3. That a "Type A" breakfast be made available for students to meet at least one-fourth of the daily recommended levels for protein, calcium, iron, Vitamin A, Vitamin C, and calories.
4. That free and reduced-price meals be provided to students who cannot afford to pay the price of the "Type A" meal.

Students shall be permitted to bring meals from home and to purchase milk and incidental items at the cafeteria.
