Background Information

- In January 2022, our Board of Education (BOE) passed a <u>Resolution</u> that directs
 the Superintendent to recommend potential changes to Board Policy ADB
 and related implementation consistent with the principles set out above and
 the School District's Mission, Vision, and End Statements. These
 recommendations are to be presented to the Board of Education.
- As a result, DCSD worked with our research partner, Hanover to develop an engagement plan for our school community (including focus groups, engagement sessions (committee, council and team) and a survey)
- Data will be analyzed and general themes will be identified
- Superintendent will present findings and recommendations to BOE
