

Every year, the Long Range Planning Committee (a community volunteer group) identifies current capital needs and future growth needs.

Student growth is projected to nearly double in size by the year 2040, with an anticipated need for 42 new elementary schools, 7 additional middle schools, and 7 additional high schools. DCSD remains one of the lowest funded school districts on the Front Range.
